Seasonal Firewood Is Available

Members of the Farm Committee volunteer their time throughout the year cutting and splitting a variety of hardwood trees (ash, cherry, oak, walnut and others) to make available for sale to members and non-members. Our wood is seasoned, cut to approx 18 inches in length, and ready to burn in either your fireplace, wood burning stove or backyard fire pit. For anyone

who has a smoker requiring either smaller cut wood (15 inches or less in length) or wood chips, we can accommodate your needs as well.

We sell stacks of firewood (half cord or full truckload quantity) to members for \$65 and non members \$75. We also have smaller sizes bundles of 8-9 pieces of Cherry wood available for \$3 per 1 lb bag. We can accommodate any other firewood quantity needs if less than full stack is required.

Proceeds from the sale of all firewood go directly to the upkeep and maintenance of all of the farm/recreational center buildings, property and equipment. The committee has recently used wood sales to repaint all of the playground equipment and refurbish the merry-go-round. We



also use these funds to keep our two tractors up and running to keep the farm grounds maintained throughout the year (grass cut/leaves mulched). In general, our wood sales help defray the costs to maintain and operate the "farm" and help keep and improve the overall appearance of our Troy Elks #833 Recreation Center.

If interested in a firewood purchase please contact Larry Baugher ((937-216-0220) or Dave Gregorovic (937-623-7703) at any time during the year. We're also out at the farm during our monthly events throughout the spring, summer, and fall months. Come out and see what we have available. If we're around, we'll even help load your wood.
