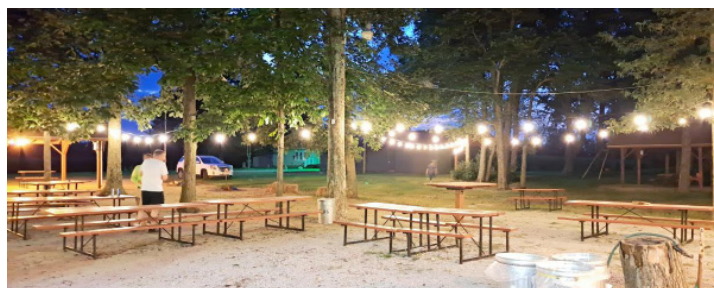

Second Sunday of the Month from 8am to 12pm all you can eat for \$10. November 13th, December 11th, January 8, February 12, and March 12.



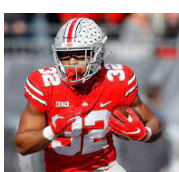
